

What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small text file that is stored on your computer or other internet connected device in order to identify your browser, provide analytics, remember information about you such as your language preference or login information. They are completely safe and cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your device. You can learn more about cookies here: https://www.aboutcookies.org.uk

What type of cookies do we use?

The list below describes the cookies we use on this site and what we use them for. Currently we operate an 'implied consent' policy which means that we assume you are happy with this usage. If you are not, then you should either not use this site, or you should delete the cookies having visited the site, or you should browse the site using your browser's anonymous usage setting (called "Incognito" in Chrome, "InPrivate" for Internet Explorer, "Private Browsing" in Firefox and Safari etc.)

First party cookies

These are cookies that are set by this website directly. We use Google Analytics, a popular web analytics service which uses cookies to help us to count the number of people that visit AboutCookies.org and to analyse how they use it (e.g., we can determine which pages on our site are the most popular ones).

Microsoft Clarity is also used on this site. It helps us understand how visitors interact with our pages through features such as heatmaps and session recordings. Clarity sets cookies (for example, _clck and _clsk) to link user sessions and improve our analysis. These cookies are only used to gather anonymised usage data to improve the website experience.

The information generated by the cookies about your use of our website (including your IP address) will be transmitted to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of our website, compiling reports on website activity and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage. Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. Google undertakes not to associate your IP address with any other data held by Google.
